Election Day: Tuesday, November 8, 2022:

- Judges Standing for Retention

· Judges may stand for retention at the General Election before their terms expire

Important Election Dates

- Voter pre-registration ends **October 24 at 5p.m.**
- Absentee ballot request forms may be requested August 30 through November 2
- Voted absentee ballots returned by mail must be postmarked on or before **November 7** or hand delivered to county auditor during business hours or **until 8pm on November 8**

Voting Information

According to Executive Order No. 7 (E07), individuals with felony convictions are eligible to vote if they have completed all terms of confinement, parole, probation, or other supervised release for all felony convictions, including the completion of any special sentence imposed pursuant to lowa Code chapter 903B (sex offender special sentencing).

- The only exception is individuals who have been convicted of a crime found in Iowa Code Chapter 707 (homicide and related crimes).
- · You do not have to have all fines, fees, or restitution paid to be eligible to vote.
